

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF MITCHELL COUNTY, IOWA

Thursday, March 28, 2013

The Board of Supervisors convened at 3:00 p.m. with all members present. Also present were Mitchell County Soil and Water Commissioners, their Director, Floyd County Supervisor Mark Kuhn, members of the public and Deb Nicklay (Globe Gazette).

Motion by Marreel, second by Voaklander to approve the agenda. All voted aye.

Larry Weber from the University of Iowa provided a background of how the Upper Cedar Watershed Management Authority was formed. He stated the Iowa Flood Center and FEMA provide information regarding water hydrology in Iowa. Floods and drought impact all of Iowa. Pilot watershed studies are being done and federal money is being allocated to assist with the newly formed watersheds. It was confirmed that no new tax levy will be established or that no lands will be placed in condemnation. It was noted that Mitchell County has the biggest land volume in the upper cedar watershed district. The watershed authority is still in a planning process.
